FOLLOWING FROM G. 11,000

- A. HAVE SEEN SUBJECT WHO I SOUNDED OUT ON LINES OF YOUR TELEGRAM 979
- B. HE, FAR FROM BEING DISCOURAGED BY MY INTIMIDATIONS OF POSSIBLE TOUGHNESS OF ASSIGNMENT, SHOWED EVEN GREATER KEENNESS.
- C. HE HOWEVER WISHES TO MAKE ONE STIPULATION WHICH IS THAT HE WILL NOT FIND HIMSELF OUT OF A JOB ON COMPLETION ASSIGNMENT OR IF GERMAN WAR ENDS BEFORE OPERATION TAKES PLACE, SINCE HIS PRESENT INTERESTING AND SPECIALIZED EMPLOYMENT IS GOOD FOR DURATION OF BOTH WARS.
- D. HE WOULD LIKE TO GET A PERMANENT CLANDESTINE JOB AND SAYS HE WOULD BE HAPPY TO LIVE IN GERMANY AFTER WAR.
