Summary:

Vasily Moskovsky gives Kim II confidential information regarding the foreign policy of the USSR and discusses the visit made by Fidel Castro to a missile regiment in the USSR.

In accordance with instructions from the center, [I] visited the First Deputy Chairman of the Council of Ministers of the DPRK Kim II. [...] [I] read out the information to Kim II [no further details given]. [...]

Having attentively listened to me, comrade Kim II thanked me for the confidential information regarding the foreign policy steps of the Soviet government.

He did not make any remarks regarding the essence of the information, having merely remarked that one must not trust the American imperialists and it is necessary to keep up one's guard with them.

In the course of the conversation that followed, I told comrade Kim II about the impression that F[idel] Castro gained from his tour of the Soviet Union [in May 1963] and his visit to one missile regiment. Kim II remarked that missiles are a good thing and added that one should let the Americans feel what kind of missiles these are [chto predstavlyayut soboi eti rakety].
