Kowalczyk's conversation with the Deputy Director in the Far Eastern Department of
Foreign Ministry – Dubrovsky[...]. The Chinese propaganda against the Soviet Union
has intensified following the Tenth CCP Congress. In recent days, they have
published anti-Soviet materials in great amounts. Their content is increasingly
harsher. According to Soviet comrades, the intensification in this propaganda is
dictated by China's internal needs (economic difficulties, factional strife, preparations
for the People's Council meeting, and so on). At the same time, this constitutes “a
scarecrow” for those who would like to ease tensions in Sino-Soviet relations./-/
