On 28 November 1950 the secretary of Kim II Sung, Mun II, personally called me by telephone, and referencing Kim II Sung, said that in fulfilling the terms of the agreement, Kim II Sung is determined to send to Mao Zedong either Pak Heon-Yeong [Pak Hon Yong] or Pak II-u [Pak II U], though the Chinese comrades expressed through Pak II-u their desire for Kim II Sung himself to go, and that he, Kim II Sung, is determined to call the members of the Political Council to him today to solicit their advice about issues that they must raise, and about whom they should send to China.

Mun II said that Kim II Sung asks your opinion on how Moscow would perceive this?

Recalling an order, I replied that it is his business, but, if he were to go himself, then it would not be bad.
