media is more often than not distorted, to have harmful effects for us and this usually ends up in the annual attack on South Africa in the United Nations. My only concern therefore is, that the relations between our two countries in the second may be further exposed and used to the detriment of both of us in the United Nations' debates and the resulting pressures.

With reference to the proposed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) I do not think that there is a misunderstanding as to the importance of this between us. I personally think it is essential and I was instrumental in my former post as Chief of the SADF in drawing up the existing MOU a number of years ago. The present MOU covers all aspects of the existing co-operation between us in the defence area and the adequacy of the provisions therein is born out by the positive relationship between us as referred to earlier in my letter. Where as any new developments in the sphere of defence between us that may need covering by a MOU could be accommodated as an addendum to the existing one, I do not see the need to draw up a new MOU which at some stage must be ratified by our Governments.

Regarding the proposals as to the regular meeting between the Ministers of Defence, I would like to confirm what Cmdt Marais has already indicated to you on my request, namely, that I think it is essential that the Ministers of Defence of our two countries should meet from time to time, but I would prefer this to remain on ad ad-hoc basis as the need arises, and that on the executive level however, by-annual meetings in the form of the present Issacom should continue. This method of co-operation was also determined previously when the existing MOU was agreed upon.

Thank you for your kind invitation to visit your country during March, but unfortunately my parliamentary commit= ments regarding legislation and the budget of my depart= ment, will not allow me to be absent from the country for the next few months.
