I am in receipt of your letter of 16 August for which I thank you. Today I had a talk with General Lee Kyung Kum and expressed my desire that he should make arrangements to go to Washington now to take part in the current negotiations there.

I am very glad to know that General Hull plans to visit Korea after the return of our Minister of Defence for the purposes you outline. We shall notify General Hull as soon as we know the date of his arrival.
