KOREAN MISSION IN JAPAN

Tokyo, October 19, 1955

TO: Office of the President

FROM: Minister Yong Shik Kim

1. The Danish, Swedish and Norwegian delegations of the Scandinavian Medical Center to be established in Seoul, paid a courtesy call on me this afternoon (October 19) together with their Ministers in Japan.

All the delegations numbering nine (9) persons will leave for Seoul via NWA on Thursday, October 20, and stay in Seoul for a few days to discuss with our side on the establishment of the said Medical Center, except for the Norwegian Minister who leave Monday,

They wish to pay a courtesy call on His Excellency the President, if possible, during their stay in Seoul.

2. Mr. Charles Hargrove, Chief of Tokyo Bureau, the Times (London) told me that he wanted to visit Seoul for about two weeks. As I reported previously, he is interested in knowing the details of the Korea-Japan relations and their background. I have already made available to him various materials to enable him to familiarize himself with the situation here.

He is expected to leave for Seoul on Saturday, October 22.
