Reference is made to the Bureau letter to Los Angeles dated September 11, 1944, and to the Los Angeles letter to the Bureau dated February 9, 1945, both in the above-captioned matter.

It was noted in referenced Bureau letter which set forth information received from the Department concerning the proposed organization for the interchange of American and Soviet films that of RKO Pictures, Incorporated, had advised the Department that on the occasion of his next visit, he expected to be able to sub-
